Tuesday 7th February

The Greater Blue Mountains

(45.00 Inc Morning Tea)

Today we set off via the F3 and M4 on route to the picture perfect Jamison Valley home of course to the world famous "Blue Mountains and Three Sisters". Stretching over one million hectares, the region is an inspiring and diverse mix of rainforest, blue-hazed valleys and golden stone escarpments. We stop for lunch (own expense) at Scenic World. While there you might want to ride the Railway or Skyway. Our return journey is via the Bells Line of Road, travelling through Bilpin & Richmond.

Monday 20th February

Sydney City Sights

(42.00 Inc Morning Tea)

See the sights that only Sydney can offer, The Rocks, Darling harbour, Mrs Macquarie's Chair, Woolloomooloo, Garden Island, Kings Cross, Double bay, Rose bay, Watsons bay, and the world famous Bondi beach while your Coach Captain provides an interesting commentary of points of interest. Bring your camera on this one and there are plenty of photo opportunities.

Monday 27th February

Picasso: Masterpieces from the Musée National Picasso Paris

(42.00 Inc Morning Tea)

This landmark exhibition of the work of Pablo Picasso (1881–1973)– arguably the most radical and influential artist of the 20th century –is drawn from the collection of the Musée National Picasso in Paris– the largest and most important repository of the artist's work in the world. The exhibition features more than 150 paintings, sculptures, drawings and prints, capturing every phase of his extraordinary career.

This unprecedented opportunity is possible because the Musée Picasso has recently closed for renovations, allowing this full-scale survey to travel for the first and, very likely, only time. Part of the Sydney International Art Series, the exhibition is co-organised by the Musée National Picasso, Paris, the Art Gallery of NSW and Art Exhibitions Australia. The Art Gallery of NSW is the only venue in the southern hemisphere on its world tour.

Monday 5th March

The Australian Botanic Garden Mt Annan & Campbelltown Catholic Club

(\$45.00 Inc Morning Tea)

The Australian Botanic Garden Mount Annan is the native plant garden of the Royal Botanic Gardens & Domain Trust. It covers 416 hectares, making it the largest botanic garden in Australia. The plantings are designed to display the diversity of the Australian flora and will eventually include many of our 25 000 known plant species.

We travel via the F3, M7 & Hume Highway to Mt Annan Garden enjoying morning tea & guided tour of the garden, before heading to Campbelltown Catholic Club for lunch (Own expense).

Tuesday 20th March

Northern Beaches & City Central

(\$42.00 Inc Morning Tea)

Travel to Palm Beach and surrounding suburbs (Televisions Summer bay of Home and Away fame) as we make our way down Sydney's Northern seaboard to the iconic Manly Beach. Here we break for lunch (own expense) and have ample free time to enjoy and explore the many facets that are on offer in and around the Corso. After lunch we travel over the iconic Sydney Harbour Bridge and travel through historic Macquarie street, Mrs Macquarie's chair where we stop for a photo opportunity. We then move on to Woolloomooloo, Kings Cross & Darling Harbour before returning home.
